



Little Pinch Pots – Stitched Up & Standing

Paints and supplies for mark making

- Paints – choose 3-4 colours of acrylic paints within your chosen palette, plus black and white. These can be inexpensive paints! Acrylic inks, watercolour bars, markers are all good to use
- Plastic container for water and one for rinsing, 2-3 small container or palette to hold paint (styro meat trays), plastic to protect your work space. Paper towel or rags. A couple empty soup or juice cans for support while stitching
- Brushes – keep it simple, mark making tools-sticks, chopstick, comb. I love using a pipette or an eye dropper for moving paint and water across the surface

Fabrics and supplies

- Fabrics – it is easiest to think of a colour scheme you would like to work in – such as brights, black/white, neutrals, 15-20+ small pieces, each not much larger than 12” x 18” Consider a variety of texture and value – we will add marks and patterns to the fabrics
- Bits of lace, doilies, leftovers from other projects
- Threads – a variety of threads suitable for hand work – embroidery floss, perle cotton, hemp, linen – choose within your colour scheme.
- Needles – suitable for use with the threads
- Embellishments – buttons, beads, charms, shells, old jewelry – look around and try something new! Stems, sticks, nails for supports
- Sewing Supplies – paper and fabric scissors, small snips or embroidery scissors, awl, thimble (if you use one), pins, paper or small bulldog clips (for holding pieces together during construction) seam ripper, a small amount of paper backed fusible web (Wonder Under or Steam a Seam)

You may prefer to wait until you read the lessons before you spend money – you’ll probably have everything you need!
